The Pahiyas Festival is held annually in honor of the Patron saint of the Filipino farmers, St. Isidore the Husbandman or San Isidro Labrador. During this time, houses are decorated with richly colored “kipings” (brilliantly-colored rice wafers) and freshly harvested farm products like vegetables and fruits. An after-noon parade and procession in thanksgiving to San Isidro highlight this colorful event.

Itinerary:

08:00 AM Pick-up from Treats in Petron Blue Wave Phase 1 in Pasay City. Depart Manila for Lucban, Quezon.

On the way to Lucban, we will take the Sariaya route. The town is also celebrating the Agawan Festival. The name describes the main features of the fiesta procession. As the parade winds its way through the streets, people snatch the goodies and other produce hanging on the houses they pass by or on a pabitin, specially made for parade. At the same time, people in the houses throw food, fruits and money into the parade. Before the parade, nearby residents decorate the outside of their homes. Colorful buntal hats are festooned all over the façade of houses.

11:00AM Early lunch at Kamayan sa Palaisdaan.

12:00NN Depart for Kamay in Jesus. (optional)

12:30PM Estimated time of arrival in Lucban.
